 All session leaders to be aware of evacuation procedures from any room/building used for an activity. Participants given guidance by the session leader about evacuation procedures in the event of a fire. A register of all participants must be held by The Smallpeice Trust staff in the room or building where the activity is taking place. Information about fire and evacuation procedures for activities and accommodation to be given by Education Officer at Welcome Address.
